'Picton House' – Holiday Home

Picton House, run by the Picton Conference, St Joseph's, is available to all districts and conferences for people in need. Anyone who comes under the criteria of needy, irrespective of race or creed is eligible to stay. All Society members and shop volunteers are also very welcome to use the house when it is available.

The bulk of families who stay at Picton House come from Nelson and Christchurch, with the busiest times being school holidays and the summer months. However, as a lovely 90 year-old lady, who drove herself from Nelson said, "I don't care if it is cold or raining. It's so restful to sit back and read a book, watch TV or stroll to town. And do what I want to do."

Many of the Christchurch-families who have stayed at the house have lived through the trauma of the earthquakes. Their stories were heart-wrenching. One family seeking respite from the quakes wrote this in the visitors' book: "A heartfelt thanks to SVDP Picton. The wonderful home and beautiful Picton surroundings gave us relief and new energy to face more days in Christchurch."

Congratulations to the Christchurch Area Council and Conferences for their involvement with these families.

Quick-fire News:

A quick round-up of news-snippets from around the country, taken from the minutes of the National Conference held on March 15th, in Wellington:

Wellington – Interest from potential members to set up a new conference in Karori.

Dunedin – A farmer offered land to grow vegetables and interest in the project had been received from the community.

Nelson – Installing Eftpos has resulted in a 40% increase in shop income. The shop has also been rated as earthquake safe.

Western Bay of Plenty – Gained seven new members for the Te Puke conference. Opened a new shop in Katikati. 'Loaves and Fishes' programme underway and has been given food from New World and Pak n Save in Tauranga.

Kapi-Mana – Food wholesaler now delivering damaged goods to the food bank. Established a school garden and some vegetables go to the food bank. Has ongoing issue with dumping of rubbish. A volunteer has taken over managing the shop.

Manawatu – New shop in Palmerston North has been operating for 12 months and has had a huge increase in donations. 'Just Released Trust' has a home that they lease rooms to released prisoners.

Christchurch – Starting a van for delivering food. Getting their wood costs down but electricity costs are very high. Rubbish dumping costs are also high. Still have people living in unsuitable conditions with the earthquake damage and floods.

West Auckland – 9th Conference is up and running. Has a Food bank. Talking to another Parish Priest about another conference. Experiencing food shortages in some conferences. Shop opening at Pt Chevalier.

South Auckland – Four shops and hoping to have a record year because of the renovations.

Hutt Valley/Wairarapa – Shop in Carterton is a huge success and have employed a full-time manager. Masterton conference has sprung back to life. Awards for window displays in Petone and Carterton. Get food from Pak n Save in Hutt Valley to distribute. Running a student assistance fund.


Marlborough – 20 members in the conference and most work in the shop. A Food bank that runs in conjunction with other charities. Working with Marlborough budgeting service. Help out at the local schools. Young Vinnies in Picton is going well. Assist with supplying uniforms. Looking forward to hosting the 2014 AGM.
